10TH CHILLY WILLY - 7TH JANUARY 2024

If ever an event lived up to its name, then surely it is this Biker's event but with it happening in January there can surely be few surprises. Like everyone else planning to attend this now classic annual event I had been keeping a keen eye on the weather forecasts made all the more important due to the exceptionally wet weather we have been enduring for much of last December.

The Gods that bring together the steel, plastics, rubber and petrol that afford so many of us great pleasure must have been smiling on us and the day dawned with dry roads and no overnight frost, perfect! Alright, I'll grant you that it was cold, but it was a plus cold, about 3 or 4 degrees but in January that was good enough for me, and seemingly hundreds of others.



Naturally the day is focused on raising



funds for the Warwickshire & Northamptonshire Air Ambulance and with an anticipated 1000 riders and pillions all making generous donations it was clear that a goodly sum would be raised. I did see one minor incident when, purely by accident, a fund raisers collection bucket was upset spilling some of the silver through a drainage channel grid. Oh dear! Not to worry because a Lambretta rider fetched some tools from his machine and soon had lifted the grating retrieving the spilled coins. Definitely not money lost down the drain.

Quite apart from the benefit for the Air Ambulance it must have done the White-Water Centre a bit of good if the queues for hot drinks and bacon or sausage bead rolls were and the rolls at £2.50, good value in anyong's book

any indication. And with the drinks at just £1.25 each and the rolls at £2.50, good value in anyone's book.

Our own branch of TOMCC was well represented with many a familiar face seen grinning from the top of well-padded jackets and Elaine's hat was stunning to behold in a striking pink colour. Dave Grundy was looking particularly harassed as he marshalled the incoming bikes into increasingly shrinking parking areas.

The variety of machines in the brim-full parking areas was huge with trikes, scooters, classics, a Suzuki race bike, Harleys, Triumphs, Beamers and just about everything else you could think of. Big bikes small bikes, off roaders, the diverse marques seemed to be endless.





Shortly before 12.00pm there was a briefing for the ride out and a huge contingent of riders set forth following the A428 South Eastwards towards Bedford. When going through Turvey it could be seen that the fields were still flooded in the valley of the River Great Ouse. The organisers had arranged to lead off with the scooters and lower capacity machines and riding generally two abreast this long snake wound its way through the local villages with groups of the public, often including small children waving as the column passed by.

At Bromham we headed South Westwards from the roundabout following the A221 to the next roundabout at Chicheley where we took a Northerly direction towards Olney following

the A509 through Olney where the town folk were lining the pavement waving and taking pictures of the passing lines of bikers.

In my opinion the standard of riding was generally quite good, I followed a guy on a GS for a good



part of the way who clearly made the task look easy, precise and unhurried, that's the way to do it. Just the odd idiot who thinks it's OK to keep spinning his head round to look at his mate and pulling wheelies. Discipline or not I would much prefer to have guys like this behind me rather than run the risk of hitting their wreckage when the trick goes wrong.



The ride returned to Northampton with still a many people staying on at the White-Water Centre to chew the fat although some decided that by then as 2.00pm approached it was time to call it a day.

Well done to all the Volunteers giving freely of their time to increase the funds for the WNAA, you are all heroes. The service does not receive any government funding and relies solely on monetary donations and support from communities in the general public. The value to the motorcycle fraternity as well as many other road users is of incalculable value.

The Warwickshire Northamptonshire Air Ambulance Service has existed for 20 years and is now merged with Leicester & Rutland and Derbyshire AA services, by 2023 collectively they had completed 50,000 missions.

If your club membership is due for renewal here are the best ways of dealing with it...

1) Renew on-line via tomcc.org/Home/Membership with a credit card, debit card or PayPal account. You can also get a £2 discount using this method.

2) Fill in the membership form that was sent to you, then post it direct to the HQ Membership address at Horley, as shown on the form. Include a cheque made payable to Triumph Owners MCC.

3) Fill in the membership form and hand it to the Branch Membership Secretary at a club night. Payment by cheque or cash. Memberships renewed this way are only sent to HQ a couple of times a month, so will take longer to process than 1 or 2 above.

Don't worry about the money as the Branch receives the same amount per member regardless of the method used to renew.
