

And I wonder whether they could have dreamed of the range of bikes that Triumph is producing these days when, in 1977, the Meriden Co-Op was limited to single-carb and twin-carb variants of a 750cc push-rod twin – the origins of which lay with the 1938 Speed Twin.

In the latter days of the factory the production line was largely based around equipment that was a couple of decades old. The oldest kit in the factory must have been the acid baths – which had been rescued from the remains of the Priory Street works destroyed in the Coventry blitz. The tour guide used to point out the shrapnel marks!

40 Years Old This Month

The first official Meeting of the Northampton branch was held on 9th March 1977 and this was the Inaugural General Meeting. Founding Chairman Mike Arnesen provided some details about this

"The history is a bit blurred now because in the mid 70s I was a bit busy: RAC/ACU instructor/ examiner, active in Northampton branch committee, active on TOMCC national committee, active in Northampton MCC, active in AJS & Matchless Owners in Stony Stratford, and active in MAG national committee; weekend racing and hill climbs; plus a job change and things have got a bit confused.

Certainly I think the branch was up and running well before 1977 because I bought my T150V in 74 and was racing it at Lydden in 76-77, and I had a T100SS before that as qualifier for the club. I raced the Trident standard for 1 year and for 1 year with 3 into 1 can in 77.

It was possibly around 77 that finally HQ recognised the branch (and the meets started at The Artichoke), because they often had problems with false starts for branches. For a while we met at the Black Horse on Wolverton Road, well known at the time as biker friendly. Can I as hell as like remember the other meeting places (bet Steve Eke would know if you can find him). My guess is the branch originated about 73-74, though to start with as a bunch of Triumph riding members of Northampton Motorcyclists Club."

Here's an extract of the minutes from that first official meeting...

Triumph Owners MCC (Northampton Branch)

Minutes of Inaugural Meeting (9th March 1977)

The chairman for the evening opened the meeting at 8.30pm and welcomed members to the first official meeting of the branch. Matters of procedure on eligibility to propose and second motions and nominations, and to stand for club office were outlined to the members.

1. Acting officers reports.

Acting Membership Secretary/Treasurer Steve Eke reported that the current membership was 24, with a further 22 social members who at one time or another had been to a meeting. It was emphasised that the social members were very welcome, and were in no way regarded as 'outsiders'. Hopefully those social members who had a Truimph machine and were eligible to join as full members would do so.

Referring to the financial situation, Steve Eke reported that the branch had a cash balance of £5.64 $\frac{1}{2}$ as at midnight 8th March 1977, this having taken account of all expenses (postage). This balance was purely due to the club night collections levied at 10p per head. No credit had been received from HQ in respect to unexpired subscriptions to which the branch was entitled.

Acting chairman Mike Arnesen reported that the response to the setting up of the branch was beyond the wildest of expectations, and this promised well for the future.

Note the cash balance (it's a bit better these days); I always wondered where the ½p came from.

Mike Arnesen: I think that you can be proud of what you started.
