Continuing on from the July Scribblings...

I told you about receiving a V5 at my address for a car with someone else's name on it, and the subsequent receipt of a penalty charge notice after it had been driven in a bus lane.

That all started on 15th June. After several weeks I managed to get a letter from the DVLA to say that the car was no longer linked to my address, a copy of which was then sent off to the Barking & Dagenham penalty charge office. It took until 12th August until I could finally relax, with the arrival of a confirmation that the penalty ticket had been (reluctantly on their part) rescinded.

Should you ever get caught up in the same situation here's what you should do:

For the V5, send it straight back to the DVLA with a note explaing that the vehicle is not connected to your address; and that you would like a confirmatory letter from them to say that the link to your house has been removed.

For any other letter in the that person's name: Don't open it and do not engage in corresspondence. If the envelope has a return address, write "Not known at this address" and return it to the sender.

2) Fill in the membership form that was sent to you, then post it direct to the HQ Membership address at Horley, as shown on the form. Include a cheque made payable to Triumph Owners MCC.

3) Fill in the membership form and hand it to the Branch Membership Secretary at a club night. Payment by cheque or cash. Memberships renewed this way are only sent to HQ a couple of times a month, so will take longer to process than 1 or 2 above.

Don't worry about the money as the Branch receives the same amount per member regardless of the method used to renew.

TriFest France – TOGA 2020

In 1959 the first TOGA (Triumph Owners Go Abroad) event took place and almost 500 TOMCC members descended on Brussels. Eight years later the second TOGA event took TOMCC to Paris. Now, 52 years later, plans are in place to take TOMCC Members abroad again - to the lovely Vercors in South-East France for 5th to 12th September 2020.

There will be daily runs for both Classic and Modern bikes, and at least one trip to a distillery with lunch for prize giving. Of course, you can always do your own thing.

The nearby towns of Grenoble, Lyon, and Valence could provide a day visit for shopping. The Route Napoleon is a must-ride with impressive gorges and cliff-side roads. There are a host of other attractions in the area - some of which we will be organising trips to.

Itinerary

Friday 4th September: UK via the Eurotunnel to Reims for overnight stay. round 350 mile ride this day. I prefer not to use toll roads in France and make it a more interesting ride down and for pillions.

Saturday 5th September: Around 370 mile ride this day on to the Camping Iris Parc at Chateau de Galaure.

Saturday-Sunday 12th-13th September: Return journey as per outward, with an overnight stay at Reims.

Accommodation

The accommodation is in luxury mobile homes, bungalows or tents. Or reserve a pitch for your own camper or tent.

A 7-night stay in a mobile home is about £250, based on 2 people sharing but can sleep 4.

Saturday morning saw us getting wet before we even met at the garage at mid-day to set off on our adventure North. Eight of us left the garage just after 12.15 and met up. with another four at the A14, making up the "Dirty Dozen". The weather was inclement to say the least on the ride up to Carnforth and the journey was littered with events: persistent rain, heavy traffic in the roadworks and an idiot crashing his Porsche on the M6 Toll. We stopped for a bit of lunch about half-way, fuelled up and set sail again.

It wasn't long before we came to a standstill again; apparently there had been a stabbing in the motorway service involving some "hairy arse bikers". Luckily it didn't involve any of us. We arrived at Carnforth Truckstop in bright sunshine, albeit a bit soggy. After drying out we all get a decent meal and had a few beers.

After a hearty breakfast on Sunday, we donned our wet gear again and plodded on. Our next stop was a Gretna, where we had a coffee and took a few snaps by the Blacksmith Shop. When we left Gretna, we headed towards Dumfries and cut across country to Kilmarnock and up the coast road from Irvine, through Largs and over the Erskine Bridge. The heading up the shores of Loch Lomond and up to Arrochar, on the banks of Loch Long.

With no need for waterproofs a few of us headed up to the Rest And Be Thankful picnic stop, where the view back up the glen was amazing.

Then we turned away from the main road and went down to Loch Goil and Carrick Castle, where we get accosted by Jehovah's Witnesses believe it or not! After having a spot of lunch in a small tea room we headed back and got caught in a heavy shower.

In the afternoon, Steve & Julie, Bev and myself, went out for a cruise on Loch Lomond. We saw a pair of Golden eagles hovering above our boat on the loch, amazing.

The rest of us (apart from Barry who wasn't feeling too good) headed down the A83 towards Campbeltown, the most southern town on the Mull of Kintyre, turning off onto a 'B' road half way there as a bit of a scenic diversion (For those not in the know Scottish 'B' roads are usually single track with passing places, and this was typical).

Campbeltown in early June hadn't really woken up and the cafes we looked at were shut but we found a bar that served food for lunch, and really good it was. Apologies to all as I nearly choked on my burger and ended up taking it away in a bag to eat later). A blast back up the almost empty A83 ended with another night in the bar.

Tuesday morning, blue skies again. Some of us rode up to Fort William, stopping at the Green Welly, a lay-by with an amazing view and Glencoe Visitor Centre en route. We grabbed some lunch in Fort William and hunted for a waterproof coat for Worm and tartan ties for LB.

Barry was feeling worse so the hotel receptionist made an appointment with the local GP (try that here!!) and being the one with the car I spent the morning ferrying him to the village surgery and then to the Vale of Leven Hospital near Glasgow, where he was diagnosed as suffering from vertigo (later pooh-poohed by the doctors in Northampton!) so he parked his bike up for the week and went walking.

On the way back I detoured to Helensburgh and along the coast and suddenly realised that we were staying only 10 miles north of the nuclear submarine base at Faslane! I'm not sure where everybody went that day but I remember that some went to Inveraray (old Jail and castle). I was planning to head towards Inveraray after lunch but an accident had closed the main road (A83) in the village and being in rural Scotland there was no easy way round so I went nowhere and spent the rest of the day in the bar looking at the view over the Loch with a cold beer.

Wednesday was Mull day. The weather was kind to us again and we set off nice and early to catch the ferry with a full tank of fuel. 12 bikes left the hotel and, eventually, 12 bikes turned up at the ferry terminal in Oban, after Big AI had taken a scenic route that only he knew about. The ferry crossing was quite smooth, which was a good job as a couple of our party haven't got the best sea legs. No name mentioned, Muttley, Bob.

So, we arrived in Mull and took a steady ride up to Tobermory, taking in the scenic coastal views with the sun beating down on us. After a stroll around Tobermory for an hour or so, some of us took a ride around the top half of the island on some pretty dire roads, but it was worth it. We stopped at Calgary Bay and it could have been the Caribbean. When we got back to Oban it was waterproofs time again and we all got a bit damp on the way back to the hotel.

Saturday morning saw us all packing up the bikes and heading south out of Bonnie Scotland, after a week of fantastic riding weather and great company. On the long trip home we all got soaked riding in some really heavy rain, whichever route was taken.

We'd just like to say "Thanks" to everyone who came, it was brilliant.
