Tiger 900 Reviewed

After testing the new Tiger 900GT I decided it was time to change the 800 XRX. I thought the 800 was a great bike but the new 900 knocks spots of it in every way. It is lighter and the engine has been moved forward and down so lowering the centre of gravity and it can certainly be felt when quickly changing direction. I decided not to go for the GT PRO as 1) it was a lot more expensive and had extras like heated seats, Triumph connect and electronic suspension that I didn't want and 2) didn't have things that I did want.

I have fitted Triumph's TSA (Triumph shift assist) which means you only need the clutch to initially put it into gear then you can change up and down without the clutch, my wrist really likes this. I've also fitted Triumphs rack and done a mod to it so it will take my Kappe box (thanks Facebook 900 owners' section for the information). I've made and mounted my own sat/nav mounting to take my new Garmin XT, which is miles better than the old Zumo, with a bigger screen and doesn't vanish when the sun hits it. Incidentally the new Triumph screen which is bigger than the old one also doesn't have this problem any more. I made my own side stand foot enlarger which initially wasn't available to buy, for a lot less than the one that you now can buy – and I had the fun making it. I've fitted front and rear fender extenders, rear hugger, headlight protector, centre stand, upper and lower crash bars and spots which I mounted via my own bracket to Triumphs mounting in the upper crash bar. I have fitted a Sound Bomb horn, which I had on the 800, as Triumph's you can hardly hear.

I know I'll get stick about having a dead cat on my seat again but I've had Easyrider custom make me a new cover for the seat. Couldn't use the old one as the seat is a different shape and I sold it on eBay.

Well it's now has the spec I want it and it still cost me less than the PRO model.

I did the last Wrinklie run on it and have done a few runs on my own and, so far, I'm loving the new bike.

Tales From Hardingstone: Smoke and Steam Part 2

We left the story (May 2020 Vibrations) at the end of 1960, with me the owner of a 1934 Scott motorcycle.

I loved it 'cause it looked like it had just come off the race track. That was the problem, my best girlfriend hated it. I admit that when, I first bought it, it did not a passenger seat so a small rubber an canvas pad and clip-on footrests were fitted – much to her disgust. She objected to the lack of rear suspension and the habit of the pilgrim pump to deliver oil mist from the carburettor bellmouth to her stockings and undies.. No, she wouldn't wear jeans and suggested a car.

Horror of horrors!! I had no licence for a car so it meant taking a test. I decided to give her her marching orders, but once more fate intervened.

I was coming home from work down Cheyne Walk towards Victoria Prom. I stopped at the traffic light and was first in the queue. I noted that traffic coming up Victoria Prom was heavy and stretched back quite a way. The lights changed and off I went. I saw that a tipper lorry was coming up the hill on my side of the road. Now, on that side of the road the railings are attached to the kerb. I had a choice of the railings, the two lanes of stationary traffic on the right, or the mad man with the tipper coming straight at me and filling the rest of the road. The only alternative was a parked car, the last car of a row parked up by users of the cattle market. I needed to get up behind it but the tipper was rapidly approaching and giving no sign of stopping so I had to speed up. I knew that I was going to hit the car (a Rolls-Royce Silver Wraith) and I did.

The Scott went up the sloping boot of the Rolls. The sudden stop caused me to take off and through the flu screen that was bolted to the handlebars; shattering it with my face. The bike bounced back after rearing up like a frightened horse and crashed on top of me, breaking my left leg.

When they examined me at the hospital, I also had a badly broken nose and broken leg. I was admitted to the ENT ward with my leg plastered from ankle to thigh. Not a pretty sight. The facial damage was caused because I wore a pudding basin helmet that did not protect my face.

We were all able to sue the mad Polish lorry driver, whose clutch had failed and who had tried to drive to his destination without stopping. I received the princely sum of £600 and was able to buy a Triumph 5TA with Avon full fairing and Rodark panniers. It never let me down. O loved it and so did my best girlfriend – she eventually became my wife.
